



## Correct those little errors ...

Here are some common errors we hear regularly in our lessons.

1. "I am agree"  
French: *je suis d'accord* → uses "être"  
English: uses a verb (agree), not "to be"  
Correct: "I agree." "I disagree"
2. "Sorry for my late"  
French "désolé pour mon retard"  
English, "late" is an adjective, not a noun. You can't use it after "my".  
Correct: "Sorry I'm late."
3. "I am actually working for XYZ"  
Actually = actuellement  
Actually = en fait  
Currently = actuellement
4. "Informations"  
Information is uncountable, therefore singular noun  
Correct: "Information"  
Other common errors : data, advice, work, knowledge, equipment
5. "I explain you"  
French : Je t'explique"  
Correct: "I will explain **to** you"
6. "I assist to the meeting"  
Assister à ≠ assist (false friend)  
Correct: I attend the meeting

### REMEMBER :

**Mistakes are part of learning**  
**They are signs of progress, not failure**  
**They are often completely irrelevant to being understood**  
**The goal is not perfection.**  
**The goal is connection.**

**So speak. Try. Adjust. Improve.**  
**Because every time you communicate, you are already succeeding.**
